Forum for Civic Initiatives (FIQ) and Kosovo Law Institute (KLI), today in the premises of Hotel Prishtina, in Prishtinë/Pristina have organized a roundtable discussion, where a report titled "Reappointment process, independence and influences" was presented. This report is part of the project "Strengthening of the civil oversight in the rule of law", supported by the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), implemented by FIQ in partnership with KLI and tried to conduct research and analyse problems encountered in the process of reappointment of judges and prosecutors, and raise these issues as matters to be addressed by relevant institutions...<u>More...</u>

Conference "Kosovo's lignite and its impact on public health" Prishtinë/Pristina, 20 October 2011 – Forum for Civic Initiatives (FIQ) has, in cooperation with few other civil society organisations, organised a conference on coal impacts on public health in Kosovo. The objective of the conference is to open the discussion with relevant international and national stakeholders involved in the energy sector in Kosovo about the prospects of avoiding the use of lignite for a healthier energy future for the country. The conference titled "Kosovo's lignite and its impact on public health", started with presentation of a study prepared by two prominent researchers from two U.S. universities, Jonathan Buonocore from Harvard University and Michael Hendryx from West Virginia University... <u>More...</u>

Activities within the "SafePlace" project to continue Prishtinë/Pristina, October 30th, 2011 – Within the "SafePlace" project implemented by FIQ in cooperation with Saferworld, the work has been intensified in recent weeks in support of the Municipal Community Safety Councils (MCSCs) in Ferizaj/Urosevac, Shtime/Stimlje and Hani i Elezit. FIQ has allocated two small grants for MCSC in Ferizaj/Urosevac and MCSC in Shtime/Stimlje. MCSC in Ferizaj/Urosevac has selected a project on direction and warning signs, as well as placing of CCTV cameras at the "Parkun e Lirise [Park of Liberty]" and at the same time setting up CCTV cameras on the main underground passage of the city... Kosovo Police: Combating economic crimes and corruption Within the project "Increase of public oversight in rule of law", which aims at assessing and supporting fulfilment of objectives in the field of security and justice within the European Partnership Action Plan (EPAP), FIQ organised a roundtable where a research titled "Kosovo Police: Combating economic crimes", prepared by FIQ and its partner organisations in this project, was presented. Police officers from the Directorate for Investigation of Economic Crimes (DIEC) stated that the research report prepared by FIQ and its partner organisations is a genuine one, and it touches upon all challenges of this Directorate, including recommendations... <u>More...</u>

Five years after having managed the Forum for Civic Initiatives (FIQ) and his long experience in this organization since its establishment in 2000, Executive Director, Ferdinand Nikolla resigned his positions from this organization following his new endeavor. He received a position in an another organisation - Saferworld from London, in its Pristina Office, which is a close partner of FIQ, where he will manage Saferworld Programme in Kosovo, and as necessary, he will be engaged in other Saferworld projects in the Balkans and other countries.
